

## State Attorney General

### Robert Tramell (D)

#### Public Safety

- Pledges to fight human trafficking, drugs, and gangs and stand up to political violence.
- As state representative, advocated for gun control laws.
- Voted to pass Georgia's hate crime law.

#### First Amendment

- Pledges to protect free speech and fair elections.
- As state representative, supported the separation of church and state in public education.



### Tanya Miller (D)

#### Public Safety

- Pledges to dismantle violent criminal networks, human trafficking rings, and those who traffic in illegal guns and deadly drugs.
- Would support local law enforcement by providing resources, training, and assistance.
- Would prioritize the prosecution of crimes against children and domestic violence.

#### First Amendment

- Pledges to fight discrimination in all its forms.
- As state representative, voted yes to HB 30, codifying the IHRA definition of antisemitism into law.



### Bill Cowser (R)

#### Public Safety

- Pledges a zero tolerance policy for violent gangs, sex traffickers, fentanyl traffickers, and undocumented criminals.
- Would create a special prosecutors office to take over prosecutions from "liberal" local district attorneys.
- Would give the attorney general's office exclusive authority to prosecute corrupt politicians.
- As state senator, voted to pass hate crime legislation and voted yes on several gun-friendly bills.

#### First Amendment

- As state senator, sponsored the Religious Freedom Restoration Act.
- Voted yes on bills limiting free speech and assembly rights.
- Abstained from voting on HB 30, which codified the IHRA definition of antisemitism into law.
- Voted yes on an anti-sharia bill.



### Brian Strickland (R)

#### Public Safety

- Pledges to expand Georgia's drug and gang task forces.
- Would target human trafficking.
- Pledges to defend the state's gun-friendly laws.

#### First Amendment

- As state senator, voted yes on the Religious Freedom Restoration Act.
- Voted yes on HB 30, codifying the IHRA definition of antisemitism into law.
- Voted yes on an anti-sharia bill.
