Energy

- Concerned with overbuilding energy infrastructure to accommodate data center needs.
- Supports ensuring power companies do not overextend their capacity planning.

Utility Costs

- Believes it is important to balance the needs of customers with the needs of Georgia Power's Integrated Resource Plan.
- Voted to freeze base price hikes from Georgia Power for at least the next three years.
- Supports having major power customers such as data centers cover most of their own costs.

Public Services

- Formerly served on the Public Service Commission, appointed by Kemp to fill the 2021 vacancy.
- Chairs the national Task Force on Natural Gas Resource Planning under the National Association of Regulatory Utility Commissioners.

Economy

- Attributes much of the utility hikes to inflation.
- Hopes the Trump administration will help alleviate cost pressures.
