Voting Rights and Election Integrity

- Believes in a fair, safe, transparent, auditable and secure election system.



Dana Barrett (D)

Voting Rights and Election Integrity

- Believes that free, fair, and secure elections are the cornerstone of democracy.
- In 2025, voted against seating two nominees to the Fulton County elections board who believed that the 2020 election was stolen from Trump.



Adrian Consonery Jr. (D)

Voting Rights and Election Integrity

- Advocates for fair access to polling sites, drop boxes, and early voting hours.
- Supports modernizing ID verification for absentee ballots.
- Would require open audits, ballot tracking systems, and published verification statistics for public review.
- Would launch voter awareness campaigns explaining how to register, request mail-in ballots, and meet ID requirements.
- Supports investing in cybersecurity and verified voting systems.



Penny Brown Reynolds (D)

Voting Rights and Election Integrity

- Supports clear and fair election rules that empower voters.
- Would expand early voting sites and accessible voting centers across counties.
- Would strengthen absentee ballot access with clear instructions and convenient drop boxes.
- Committed to rebuilding public confidence through transparent processes and voter education.
- Supports nonpartisan election integrity and protecting election workers from threats and political pressure.



Tim Fleming (R)

Voting Rights and Election Integrity

- Supports secure, accessible, fair, and trusted elections.
- Supports strong voter ID laws and election transparency.
- Would deport any undocumented individuals attempting to vote in Georgia.
- As a House representative, sponsored bills prohibiting Georgia from participating in a multistate nonpartisan voter integrity database.
- Sponsored a bill allowing counties to opt out of Saturday early voting.
- Sponsored a bill prohibiting foreign nationals from participating in or contributing to any campaign.



Vernon Jones (R)

Voting Rights and Election Integrity

- Supports limiting absentee ballots to active-duty military, citizens who are disabled, and retired Georgians.
- Supports strengthening voter ID requirements to ensure only U.S. citizens are able to vote in Georgia elections.



Kelvin King (R)

Voting Rights and Election Integrity

- Supports a hybrid vote tabulation system where ballots are counted and tabulated by hand.
- Would withdraw Georgia from participating in a multistate nonpartisan voter integrity database.
- Supports training and supporting election staff and county election offices year-round.



Ted Metz (R)

Voting Rights and Election Integrity

- Supports local election offices having primary responsibility to administer elections.
- Supports returning to hand-marked paper-only ballot voting systems.
- Would get rid of early voting.
- Supports limiting the use of absentee ballots to those who are traveling or are infirm.



Gabriel Sterling (R)

Voting Rights and Election Integrity

- As Chief Operating Officer at the Secretary of State's office, built a high-capacity absentee ballot system and secured protective equipment and sanitizer for counties during the COVID-19 pandemic.
- After the 2020 elections, defended election workers and called on President Trump and others to stop spreading disinformation surrounding the November General Election.
