- Supported legislation that eliminated QR codes on ballots, and legislation that requires all counties to report absentee ballots within one hour of polls closing.
- **Indicted** in the Fulton County 2020 election interference case.

Immigration

- Voted YES on HB 1105 (2024), the Georgia Criminal Alien Track and Report Act, requiring local law enforcement to verify immigration status and cooperate with ICE.

First Amendment

- Voted YES on HB 30 (2024), codifying the IHRA definition of antisemitism into Georgia law.
